Consider the use of charts, graphs and/other graphics to help your audience understand the issues. **Recommend no more than 7-10 slides.** 

Do not focus on your country's legislation. Tell briefly: how the case came to your attention, or the conduct was detected, the crime or misconduct committed, the investigative techniques used, possible alternative techniques and methods, matters of proof, interagency cooperation, international cooperation, and the outcome of the case.

No more than 20 minutes will be given to present the topic in class and the remaining 10 minutes will be for questions from your colleagues. Time management is critical, and we will ask you to stop your presentationafter 20 minutes to allow for questions. Please plan your presentation carefully.
