Support countries with data, tools, and capacity to monitor and manage the ocean sustainably, enabling informed decisions and progress toward SDG 14.






UN Ocean Decade




Potential structure of the GEMS Ocean Programme, including a proposed governance mechanism












- Combine and display global 4-dimensional break down of Essential Ocean Variables

- Chlorophyll a concentration








