## Healthcare Week Luxembourg: How Artificial Intelligence (AI) transforms healthcare

Luxembourg, 20 March 2025. – The upcoming third edition of Healthcare Week Luxembourg (HWL) in 2025 will explore the opportunities and challenges posed by Artificial Intelligence (AI) within the healthcare sector and for healthcare professionals.

The two-day conference is set to take place on 7 and 8 October 2025 and will host presentations and panels featuring notable international speakers. It will serve as a platform for experts to engage in discussions, roundtables and debates regarding the future of healthcare, the influence of AI and practical strategies and solutions, and invites participants to explore over hundred exhibits from a wide array of specializations in the sector.

Healthcare Week Luxembourg targets professionals in healthcare, research, education and technological innovation as well as representatives from governments, ministries, professional and social institutions. The event organised by the Federation of Luxembourg Hospitals (FHL) in partnership with Quinze Mai (QM) is scheduled for 7 and 8 October 2025 at Luxexpo The Box. "The third edition will concentrate on the influence of Artificial Intelligence within the healthcare sector and enable us to address the significant ethical, technological and practical challenges faced by healthcare professionals, whether in politics, research, academia, industry, startups or in practice. The healthcare landscape is undergoing significant transformation. HWL 2025 seeks to support a diverse range of professionals in understanding and leveraging the impact of AI in their work, with the goal of improving the lives of millions of patients, in hospitals, doctors' practices and at home."

HWL 2025 is set to conduct a webinar titled "AI & Healthcare – From theory to practice" on 3 April 2025 at 5pm CET. This session aims to familiarize an international audience with the conference theme, initiate the debate and collect feedback to enrich the conference agenda. The webinar will be opened with presentations of Dr. Philippe Turk, President of FHL, Dr. Giovanni Briganti, Endowed Chair of AI & Digital Medicine at the University of Mons in Belgium, as well as Dr. Alexandre Hébert, Director General for Medical Affairs of the Belgian healthcare organisation Vivalia.
