Why should you care about the gender & climate nexus

Empowering women can dramatically accelerate the world's capacity to tackle climate change. Women leaders drive decisions that are more **sustainable**, and more **equitable**.

Did you know?



Only **25%** of parliamentarians across the world are women.

(UN Women, 2020)



Women made up only 37% of representatives at UN climate negotiations in 2018.



- Make gender a central pillar of your climate strategy.
- Ensure you have diverse teams and leadership working on climate action.



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Did you know?



In the private sector, companies with more women on their boards & in senior positions outperform their competitors in financial & sustainability performance.



16.9% of board members and only **6%** CEOs. (Catalyst, 2020)

What can you do?

- Seek to achieve full gender balance at all management levels in your company.
- Reinforce a gender lens in your environmental and sustainability strategies.



Empowering women can dramatically accelerate the world's capacity to tackle climate change.

Giving women equal access to resources and opportunities improves climate outcomes.

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Did you know?



Giving women access to the same resources and legal rights as men could grow farm yields by **20-30%**, reducing hunger, poverty and land-use expansion contributing to climate change.



But, women own only **12.8%** of land globally and have far less access to finance & training than men.

(UNFAO, 2015)

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Did you know?



Investing in girls' education and reproductive health could diminish global carbon emissions by as much as **51.48** gigatons by 2050.



But, today, only **1 in 3** girls complete lower secondary education in the developing world.

- Integrate gender analysis in all decisions and actions on climate & sustainability.

Did you know?



Green Science, Technology, Engineering & Math (STEM) jobs are projected to **grow by 29%** in the coming decade.

But, today women are less than 20% of the STEM workforce, potentially impeding their access to these new opportunities.

Did you know?



Social & economic inequalities mean that women are at greater risk during natural disasters.

(CARE International, 2020)



Women and girls are 14 times more likely to die during extreme weather events (UNDR 2013), which also increase rates of sex trafficking by 20-30%.
